Nearby Attractions

Jackson's Mill – Visit the boyhood home of General Thomas "Stonewall" Jackson. General Jackson, who grew up in Lewis County, is among our nation's most storied military leaders. Take a stroll back in time and witness living history as it really was. (304) 269-5100.

Lambert's Winery – The Lambert family has created an estate that is as lovely as the wine they produce. Tasting and tours of one of our region's newest treasurers are offered daily. (304) 269-4903.

Historic Trans-Allegheny Asylum– Formerly known as the "Weston State Hospital". Listed on the National Archives of Historical Places and featured on the Sci-Fi channel's popular "Ghost Hunters" series. Tours offered daily. (304)269-5070

Stonewall Jackson Lake Dam and State Park – The Visitors Center beneath the Stonewall Jackson Dam is full of interesting displays and information from around the area. The foot of the dam is also an excellent fishing hole, especially for trout. There are many superb fishing spots/holes on and around the lake allowing you to enjoy year-round fishing. (304) 269-0524
